

On June 6th, 1944, 14,000 Canadian soldiers, supported by 10,000 Royal Canadian Navy seamen and members of the Royal Canadian Air Force, landed on a 10 km stretch of beach in Normandy, France as part of Operation Overlord, the Allied plan to liberate Europe from Nazi occupation and oppression. The largest seaborne invasion in history transported 156,000 American, British and Canadian soldiers across the Channel from England to France. Military success, as always, came at a cost. Of 1,074 Canadian casualties on the first day of operations, 359 were killed, and lie buried far from home in the beautiful Canadian War Cemetery at Bénny-sur-Mer.
